Re: 2024 NWCG Executive Board Annual Letter

As we reflect upon the successes and challenges of 2023, it is my privilege to share with you the Annual Letter for the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG). Your commitment to our mission and the exceptional work each of you does serves as the cornerstones of our success. Looking to the future, as we navigate an incredibly complex and dynamic environment, it is important to remain focused on our mission, while continually engaging in conversations nationally on the many wildland fire initiatives.

To highlight a few significant accomplishments and milestones in 2023:

- The initiation of the Incident Performance and Training Modernization (IPTM) effort. NWCG began implementing a \$28 million contract designed to overhaul the current system and replace it with an integrated performance-based training system. Ten positions were started in 2023 and planning for 16 more in 2024 has begun. In total, NWCG intends to analyze over 130 incident positions to incorporate efficiencies and reduce redundances.
- The Incident Management Team (IMT) Course Steering Committee was developed and tasked with creating two new IMT courses to support implementation of Complex Incident Management (CIM).
- 10 new Wildland Safety Training Annual Refresher (WFSTAR) videos were developed with more than 42,000 views spread across all videos.
- Coordinated the process of moving all the training found in the NWCG Training Catalogue to the Wildland Fire Learning Portal (WFLP) and maintaining the current system.

NWCG welcomed the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) as the newest associate member to the NWCG Executive Board (EB) in December of 2023. 2023 brought several changes to EB membership. We would like to acknowledge the service of those EB members who have left us and express our gratitude for their contributions.
